EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW

with Dr. Nirodha Bandara





This was organised by the Australian Trade and Investment commission, South Asia. The Australian government that organised this felt that Royal Institute was a school that deserved a platform to go abroad and get exposure to different universities. So, I was part of that delegation with two other Sri Lankan schools and a few other schools from India and Bangladesh. It was a great opportunity to meet school leaders from other schools in the region, as well as go to Australian universities, to explore opportunities there. Because of the connections, we recently had a webinar with the University of Queensland. I want to bring those connections to Sri Lanka, to Royal Institute, so that it can benefit all of you.

The last edition of the school newsletter featured you. We learned that you believe in a holistic approach for education. Can you tell us a little bit about this approach?

Holistic education is where the learning focuses on the entire individual. It encompasses a person's intellectual, emotional, physical, social, and spiritual growth. It is about having a deep understanding of oneself and the rest of the world. It is about being well rounded, and well balanced. Life is not going to go smoothly, so we have to be able to adapt all the time. Having a holistic education, will help students face challenges.

I encourage students to participate in extracurricular activities. Even if you fail, even if you do not win, you are learning from the experience. Holistic education is all about that experience and the grounding that you get when you are in school. When you go out into the real world, you will have no issues. You will not feel stressed. There are all sorts of issues, especially nowadays you hear about many mental health problems. If we focus on these aspects, I do not think any of our children would have to worry about concerns with their mental health in the future.







You joined Royal Institute International School at a young age and have played a key role in its growth. How has your leadership helped shape the school to meet the needs of future youth?

This is something that I have been telling since day one to all our principals and teachers – every child matters. Each child has a different style of learning and absorbing information. Their emotional needs are different. We have to be able to accept that without putting aside any child.

The most important thing for me is looking after each child. I have never focused on getting many students in where I cannot cater to all their needs. I think Royal Institute International School does not have that goal in mind. We want to ensure all our children do well in their academics, but also ensure that they participate in other activities. Through that, we will be helping our students to build resilience and develop the ability to adapt to any situation.

Madam, what inspires you to continue to serve Royal Institute in your capacity as Academic Director?

It is all about giving back to the school that nurtured me, that gave me the foundation and made me who I am today. I was an introvert in school. I was scared to talk in public. I openly say this to encourage others to come out, and be more confident. I was very nervous at that time. It was my teachers who encouraged me. Now I am able to give a speech or talk to people with confidence. Therefore, inspiration for me is about giving back to society. I feel I am able to help mould students in some way, through the teachers and principals.

Who inspires you the most?

My parents would definitely be the ones who inspire me. Because, they founded Royal Institute International School. I have seen them since I was small, how they would come back home. My father was very busy with Royal Institute Institute International School. My mother was a principal of the Royal Institute, Nugegoda branch. I remember her coming back home with a bundle of reports, so that she could sign them. She would still bring work home. Even setting of timetables, she would do it as a principal, not the teachers, not sectional heads. Therefore, they inspired me.

Both my parents are teachers. They taught maths and my mother taught computing as well. So, they were very passionate about what they did. Even at dinner, any conversations we had at home wereabout Royal Institute International School. They always tell me even now, "Do it for the children".

Students who follow their education in English language are attuned to foreign cultures. Do you worry about the loss of indigenous knowledge and culture in students? And what do you propose we do to retain the indigenous knowledge and culture?

No, I do not worry about it because I feel, especially with Royal Institute students, there is a strong grounding in our country's culture and values. To retain this we still have, our cultural activities. Through the subject Ethics, we try to bring in those values, to our classrooms. So simple things like respecting the environment that you are in and your parents.

We do not have to worry at Royal Institute because I have never seen students at Royal Institute being boastful saying "We have money" or "We are better off than you". I have always seen students treat the maids and security guards very nicely. I think our students will not lose the good values as long as you are well grounded in a nurturing environment.

There is an exodus of young professionals leaving the country, which obviously is draining the knowledge and skills of future workforce. How can we encourage young people who migrate to return home and contribute to the country's economy?

People believe the grass is greener on the other side. We hear stories of people who really struggle in those countries trying to achieve. I always say you can make a better impact in this country. Those countries are bigger and have many resources. You will be lost in the crowd. If I was there, I will not be working in this capacity. I will not be able to make the decisions that I can make at Royal Institute.

Now you see so many people returning to Sri Lanka. Young people who are really adding value to the economy. You can add a lot of value to this economy compared to other countries. I always encourage people to come back because this little country needs us.

Today's world is challenging for any youngster. As they leave school, as aspiring youngsters what is the one piece of advice you would give?

Do not force yourself to do something that someone else has put into your head. You have access to information, so do your own research. You can check what career options are available. Do not be afraid to try out. You should not regret anything. Because whatever you choose, that experience will enhance you. Just let nature take its course.


Vesak Day

A Teacher's Aspiration

In an education system often driven by grades and syllabi, Ms. Nirmala Silva is a teacher who looks beyond test scores. With over 20 years of experience, she approaches every child with compassion, patience, and a deep belief that education is not about how fast one moves, but how far one grows. For her, the classroom is a place where every child — whether outgoing or reserved, fast or slow — deserves equal attention and care.

While it's easy to spot the shining stars, Ms. Nirmala is drawn to the quiet learners, the hesitant voices, and the late bloomers. Her goal is simple yet profound: to ensure no child is left behind. Whether a student is disruptive or withdrawn, she meets them where they are, encouraging them to reflect, find their strengths, and grow in confidence.

Her inspiration to become a teacher came from a Catholic nun who once volunteered to teach English to hostellers. Ms. Nirmala wasn't strong in English and often avoided class, but that teacher never gave up on her. She goes beyond the page, she encourages the proficient in this essential tool in order to establish their identity and thrive in their chosen fields.

It's not just her passion for teaching that sets her apart — it's the time, effort, and self-improvement she commits to every day. For her, each lesson is not only a chance to teach but also to learn. She sees reading and writing not as difficult skills but as underused tools that can unlock potential when nurtured properly.

Ms. Nirmala's classroom is more than a space for worksheets. It's a space for stories, reflection, and honest conversations. A space where every voice is heard and valued. When asked to describe her teaching style, she answers with one word:

"Wholesome. I nourish my students in every possible way – with knowledge, discipline, and values."

Through her dedication and heart, Ms. Nirmala continues to shape young minds with care, integrity, and purpose.
